St Louis Climate Summit

In April this year, St Louis University in the US (a Jesuit university) hosted a Climate Summit at which some of the world's leading environmentalists and scientists spoke. Excellent presentation followed excellent presentation. A young woman confessed that while attending an international environment conference she was embarrassed to be American. Jeffrey Sachs, world-renowned professor of economics and senior UN advisor, condemned US politicians. "Almost everything you hear from our politicians is phony. Our democracy has been suborned by massive corporate corruption. The week before Donald Trump announced that the US would pull out of the Paris agreement, 22 senators, all Republicans, wrote to him calling on him to pull out. Why? Because they're all on the take from the oil industry."

Japan

May 2018

... the Long-term Energy Supply and Demand Outlook compiled in July 2015, stated that the electric power supply-demand structure in fiscal 2030 would be as follows: renewable energy approximately 22 to 24%, LNG 27%, coal 26% and oil 3%, reducing dependence on nuclear power plants, which had been about 30% before the 2011 Tohoku earthquake and tsunami, to around 20 to 22%.

The recommendations have been widely covered by various media, focusing particularly on the explicit statements of "making renewable energy a major power source" and "decreasing Japan's dependency on nuclear energy." While every member of the Round Table agreed on renewable energy, there were heated discussions over "decreasing Japan's dependency on nuclear energy," between members from industry insisting, "This shouldn't be included," and our side, who wanted to include it explicitly. In the end, the statement remained in the recommendations with no changes.

(Awareness that the goals set under the Paris Agreement could not be achieved by continuing current energy policy and conventional discussions led to establishment of the Round Table by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry [METI].) https://www.japanfs.org/en/news/archives/news_id036082.html

On July 3rd, 2018, the Japanese Cabinet approved the nation's fifth Strategic Energy Plan (SEP). It maintains the government's previous policy directions by continuing to place an emphasis on nuclear power and coal as 'base-load' energy sources for electricity, and fails to consider the dramatic changes currently occurring in global energy trends. The SEP neglects the strong public desire for a major shift toward renewable energy and a move away from nuclear and coal.

In June 2018, Sumitomo Corporation announced its proposed Sendai-Takamatsu combustion plant will switch its fuel from coal-biomass mixed fuel to biomass mono-fuel combustion. As a result, the number of remaining proposed domestic coal-fired plants becomes 35. (There have been 50 plans since 2012. Among them, 8 have already started operating and 7 have been canceled or changed their fuel.)

However, biomass single fuel combustion also has problems from an aspect of the environment and sustainability. The supply source is still unclear, and might lead to serious damage to the environment.
